MEETING NOTES	Meeting notes approved as written.
UPDATES	<u>Travel Trainings</u> – PAFC is coming up with a schedule for travel trainings. Enzio's has closed in downtown Fort Collins, so the STC will have to come up with a new restaurant for regional Travel Trainings. Ruth stated she will inquire about travel trainings on Bustang. Loveland has hired a Bicycle and Pedestrian Planner.

Discussion Items

LARIMER COUNTY SENIOR TRANSPORT STUDY	presentation to the group. Best practices were divided into peer communities and possible services. A draft survey was handed out for comments. Suzette asked how many responses are needed to be statistically valid. Katy stated they are looking for 400 survey responses. The group discussed the length of the survey, as older adults may be less willing to complete a long survey. The group suggested added directions stating respondents can have their children or aides read questions to them. A copy of the survey will be emailed out for comments and feedback. STC members also discussed focus groups, including locations. Four are being planned across unincorporated Larimer County. What barriers exist for seniors to attend these focus groups? Would an RSVP be required to attend? Information will be decided and forwarded to the group.
5310 FUNDING	Alex stated he had reached out to David Averill about 5310 funding in Larimer County. It is currently used for the NFRMPO's Mobility Coordination Program and for the Dial-a-Taxi program. The group decided it should reach out to David for more information about funding.

She stated Colorado is not investing as much as other states into these areas. COPIRG is looking for people to speak up at CDOT meetings to bring attention to this funding gap.								
MEYER	Lynda recently met with Kelly from the Larimer County Health Department. They talked about transportation needs for Loveland and Fort Collins.								
GORDON	Alex will work on reserving the room for next year's meetings.								
THOMAS	The Strategic Action Plan on Aging was emailed out by Alex. Working on an executive summary for Senator Kefalas.

Available Transportation Services

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
