Changes at Wood Street


It's with much regret that we must inform our Fort Collins serviced routes that Marty has transferred from Wood St. and will no longer be the person servicing our vans.

Cone Zone Driving Tips

A Guide for Safely Navigating Construction and Summer Road Conditions



According to a recent AAA study, nearly 80% of drivers "expressed significant anger, aggression, or road rage behind the wheel at least once in the past year." As vanpoolers traveling long distances daily, we're sure you've been witness to this behavior on occasion.

In fact, what prompts this short topic is an incident where one of our vans was followed by an angry driver. Thankfully, our vanpooler responded correctly. So, what did he do?

- Avoided eye contact
- Did not respond
- Drove to a public area (and actually circled the parking lot a few times)
- Stopped, but did not exit the van or roll down the window

Keep in mind you want to diffuse the situation, not further heighten the tension.

Summertime: longer days, warmer weather, and major traffic delays. The same reasons that make it great for an evening bike ride make it a great time to catch up on roadway maintenance and repairs. Whether you are a pedestrian, cyclist, or driver, consider the following tips to help you safely navigate this season's Cone Zone. - 1. Go Slow. Construction zones may require slower speeds to ensure the safety of workers and road users. Obey all posted speed limits and use caution when traveling through construction zones.
- 2. Share the Road. If you are driving, provide alternative mode users plenty of space and only pass when safe to do so.
- 3. Remain Alert. Driving distracted is one of the leading causes of crashes. Remain alert and minimize distractions while driving, biking, or walking. If you have to use your phone, pull over when it is safe to do so before checking any text messages or making any phone calls.
- 4. Anticipate Time Delays. Inevitably, construction can lead to temporary delays along your tried and true routes. Do not get caught off guard, leave earlier than you normally would or plan an alternate route.

 Apps, like Waze, provide up-to-date information about construction zones and travel time.

Speeding

We here at the VanGo™ offices take safety as paramount to operating a successful program. That's why it's always worrisome when we get calls from other drivers making comments about the driving behaviors of one of our vans. Yes, we are an easy target with our phone number in bold prominently displayed but this fact doesn't change the perception of the other drivers. Let us not forget that our vans are our best and most visible form of advertising and that how they operate is a direct reflection on the program.

One of the most common calls is that our vans are speeding. We know it's called 'rush' hour but, according to a recent NHSTA study, more than 10,000 deaths per year are a direct result of drivers not adhering to the posted speed limits or adjusting their speed for conditions. It's important to note that VanGo™ vans, in many cases, may be larger than your normal car-and are hopefully carrying more than your personal car; this difference in weight and size translates to longer stopping distances; speed simply increases this further.

Besides phone calls we've also seen an increase in photo enforcement notices. And, while we enjoy seeing pictures of participants, note that we do see these violations as the responsibility of the driver. Upon receipt of any photo enforcement ticket we will research and notify the enforcement division whom the responsible driving party is so the ticket can be assigned correctly.

Be safe out there vanpoolers. We know sometimes you get hung up, someone is late to a pick-up, weather slows the traffic, but never forget that it's always best to arrive late and safe then to be involved in an incident.

402 Park-N-Ride and I-25 Construction

If your route utilizes the 402 Park-N-Ride you've likely already noticed the increased truck traffic and subsequent road deterioration. Please be aware that CDOT is aware of the situation. The truck traffic will likely continue to increase as the contractors begin work on I-25 and CDOT is asking graciously for your patience, but also wants to ensure the road remains such that it is not a danger to regular drivers.

Some VanGo™ participants have already reached out to me concerning the current road conditions and CDOT has assured me they are working hard at mitigating and staying on top of this. Your patience is appreciated; while it may offer a new wrinkle in your daily use of the Park-N-Ride, it is being done so that your experience there and on the interstate is better in the long term.
