






Environmental Justice (EJ)


Background

2016 Non-Motorized Plan


- Updated and expanded on the 2013 Regional Bicycle Plan
- Expanded the focus to include pedestrian travel









Table 4.6 Corridor #6 - Poudre River Trail

The Poudre River Trail Corridor is a nationally-recognized bicycle and pedestrian corridor. The 53 mile corridor within the NFRMPO region is the most public-recognized infrastructure in the plan and model for the regional collaboration required construct a trail between multiple jurisdictions. The collaborative effort has yielded generous amounts of state and federal dollars. When complete, it will connect: Larimer County, Fort Collins, Timnath, Weld County, Windsor and Greeley.
