MEETING NOTES	No comments.
ONE CALL/ONE CLICK CENTER UPDATES	Schmitt provided an update on the RideNoCo name and logo, including providing background on the name change. Schmitt explained the name should have a geographic tie to the region and beyond. The NFRMPO is working with a graphic designer to flesh out the logo and brand standards. The program will be going with the slogan "Connecting you & Northern Colorado" to capture both the individual and regional mobility goals of the program. The graphic designer will be designing a symbol based on the logo to be recognizable and included on vehicles and in branding. Mason asked what about the timeline, and Schmitt answered phase 1 of the website will happen by mid-summer. Brown recommended using the Wave add-in for Chrome for accessibility.

Discussion Items

2021 WORK PLAN	Gordon explained this was his last meeting at PAFC as Schmitt takes over the Mobility program. Lorye explained the Mobility & Access Priority Group (MAPG) is one of four of PAFC's priority groups, focused on transportation education and outreach. Ideas for 2021 projects include discussions with United Way 211, transportation funding and project priority lists, virtual travel trainings, and working to support the Larimer County Farmers Market. Mason noted the rollout of the One Call/One Click Center (OCOCC)/RideNoCo program will also be a major project. The group discussed drafting a survey to identify new and current members who could participate in the group. Russo noted Transfort is looking into doing a "Return to Transit" campaign that could help bring people back to riding transit. Morgan noted cross-boundary trips are still a struggle for the region as
COVID VACCINATION TRANSPORTATION AND	Schmitt provided background on Larimer County's efforts for vaccinations and the need for coordinating transportation. Schmitt noted the County, providers, and the MPO want to cut down on the number of calls and steps each person needs to
	take, so much of the work will take place behind the scenes. The group discussed

COMMUNICATION	how second vaccination trips will work, including scheduling both trips at once or
	having people tell their driver the date/time of their next appointment. The group
	also discussed how to balance which providers receive the trips based on
	availability and geography. Morgan noted his volunteers may be able to help
	because some may not be able to provide rides. Schmitt noted the process is
	being finalized with the providers, the County, and the NFRMPO, and he will make
	a fact sheet to send to the group.

Member Updates

	Russo noted the FLEX to Boulder runs on Saturday as of January 18. Transfort will
	be tightening restrictions for masks on buses. A new CDC and Executive Order
	require masks to cover the nose and mouth and must be worn at all times on the
RUSSO	bus and at stops. Scarves, bandanas, and other coverings no longer suffice.
	Transfort may look at its budget to see if it can help provide masks to passengers
	without them.

Introducing... RideNoCo

The One Call/One Click Center officially has a name and a logo — **RideNoCo**. The slogan "Connecting You & Northern Colorado" embodies the two overarching goals of the program to improve both individual and regional mobility in Larimer & Weld counties. The program will be introduced to the region in the coming months as a website is built and a fully operational call center launches. Vaccine Transportation Project Launches

Key funtions of the One Call/One Click Center Project laid out in the Larimer County Senior Transportation Implementation Plan have been fast-tracked to support regional efforts to remove barriers to access for COVID vaccines, especially for populations such as older adults and individuals with disabilities. Partnerships with the Larimer County Office on Aging and the Weld County Area Agency on Aging for funding of rides has allowed the vaccine project to encompass the entire region and as of March 19, the project has received 12 calls, 7 requests for transportation, and has connected 6 people to their vaccine appointments. To get transportation to and from your vaccine appointment, please tell your healthcare provider at the time of scheduling or call (970) 514-3636 if your appointment has been scheduled.

Envision Receives New Van for Clients



The NFRMPO, 60+ Ride, and Envision worked together to repurpose FTA §5310 funds to purchase a 2020 ADA Braun Entervan for use by Envision to transport their clients with developmental disabilities to

programming and other community destinations.

The van was delivered in January 2021 and has already been put into service. The NFRMPO Mobility Program is able to partner with community agencies such as Envision to provide administrative support in purchasing new vehicles.

Estes Hiring Transit Program Assistant

The Town of Estes Park is in search of service-minded individual to join the Public Works Department's Parking & Transit Team as a Transit Program Assistant. This seasonal position will work closely with the Parking & Transit



Manager to ensure efficient and effective delivery of the Town's seasonal transit service, Estes Transit. This position will also have the ability to assist staff in exploration of other transportation offerings including parking management, micromobility, and pedestrian connectivity.

The hourly range for this position is \$16.00 - \$19.00 per hour, depending on qualifications and experience. Please note that this position offers retirement as the only benefit.


Front Range Passenger Rail Moves Ahead



The Southwest Chief and Front Range Passenger Rail Commission has released a report that lays out a framework and longterm vision for passenger rail along the Front Range.

The reports provide a vision for new travel options and identifies three alignment recommendations, primary station locations, and preliminary service characteristics between Fort Collins and Pueblo. Taking a phased approach that starts with limited service and track improvements, the reports also lay out governance and funding options to make the service a reality. NFRMPO staff continues its work on the <u>Coordinated</u> <u>Public Transit/Human</u> <u>Services Transportation Plan</u>, also known as the Coordinated Plan. The <u>Coordinated Plan</u> identifies existing conditions, gaps, and strategies to address those gaps in mobility for older adults and individuals with

disabilities. Throughout the next few months, NFRMPO staff will be attending meetings to discuss concerns and help identify projects and strategies that can be implemented in Larimer and Weld counties.

Coordination of Coordinated Plans

Boulder County has begun their first Coordinated Public Transit/ Human Services Transportation planning process. The Plan will identify current and future mobility needs of older adults, individuals with disabilities,



low income residents, and youth (<18). The Plan will also consider the growing interregional travel between Boulder County and Larimer and Weld counties. The region's continuing urbanization along with rising housing costs has created the need for more collaboration to meet the region's mobility needs, as people need to access jobs, healthcare, and other activities beyond county lines. PROGRAM UPDATES

What is the Mobility Coordination Program?— Mobility Coordination program activities are centered on education and cooperative resource-sharing to use existing transportation dollars most efficiently. NFRMPO Examples include travel training, cooperative research, public forums, program implementation, FTA grant administration and public education. The NFRMPO Mobility Coordination Program is funded with Federal Transit Administration (FTA) §5310 funds. Funding has been secured for §5310 funds from both CDOT for Weld County and Fort Collins on behalf of the Fort Collins-Loveland-Berthoud TMA.

Rider's Guide Updates—Approximately 84 users have logged onto the online service to find potential service matches since January 1, 2021, with 90.1percent of users being new.
