NFRMPO Releases Environmental Justice (EJ) Plan for Public Comment

Fort Collins, Colorado— Residents of the North Front Range Metropolitan Planning Organization (NFRMPO) region are invited to share their thoughts and feedback on the draft **Environmental Justice (EJ) Plan** during a 30-day public comment period. This 30-day public comment period begins on Wednesday, February 3, 2021 and closes on Thursday, March 4, 2021.

The North Front Range region enjoys a diverse and growing community. The rapid and continued growth of the region requires that transportation investments keep up with development to maintain a vibrant economy. To better incorporate this increasing diversity into future plans, programs, and efforts, the NFRMPO is pleased to release the draft **EJ Plan**. The **EJ Plan** builds on the limited EJ analyses NFRMPO staff currently undertakes.

Through the **EJ Plan**, the NFRMPO seeks to ensure the regional transportation planning process better reflects the needs and expectations of residents regardless of income, race, national identity, disability status, or ability to speak English. To reflect this goal, the **EJ Plan** consists of four key components: an existing regional demographic profile and analysis of low-income and minority populations as well as new communities of concern; recommendations for improving and creating a more inclusive transportation planning process in the North Front Range region; best practices from local, regional, state, and national examples; and a community resources inventory.
