Upcoming Transportation GHG Rulemaking

The transportation sector is a leading contributor of greenhouse gases (GHGs) in the State of Colorado. This spring, the Air Quality Control Commission (AQCC) is scheduled to consider a rulemaking to reduce GHGs from transportation. The rulemaking is part of an ambitious effort to address climate change and meet the state's science-based climate targets of reducing GHGs 26 percent by 2025, 50 percent by 2030, and 90 percent by 2050 from 2005 levels, as outlined in the state Greenhouse Gas Pollution Reduction Roadmap ("GHG Roadmap").




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The AQCC rulemaking will address two of the nine near-term actions identified in the GHG Roadmap for the transportation sector, including GHG pollution standards for transportation plans and trip reduction programs for large employers. The Colorado Department of Transportation (CDOT) is leading the stakeholder process for the GHG pollution standards for transportation plans, while the Colorado Department of Health and Environment (CDPHE) is leading the stakeholder process for the proposed Employee Traffic Reduction Program (ETRP).

The AQCC is scheduled to review the draft proposal at their May 20-21 meeting. A rulemaking hearing on the proposal is anticipated to be scheduled for the AQCC's meeting on August 19-20, 2021.

Environmental Justice Plan




The NFRMPO periodically evaluates its programs, policies, and projects to ensure they are accessible and available regardless of income level, race or nationality, or language ability. This is becoming increasingly important as the region grows rapidly and diversifies. As part of this evaluation, NFRMPO staff embarked on the Environmental Justice (EJ) Plan, talking to residents, local nonprofits, and partner agencies to identify shortcomings in and best practices for equity and inclusion in the transportation planning process. Broadening the lens with equity and inclusion. NFRMPO staff identified additional communities of concern, including individuals with disabilities, older adults, youth, and femaleheaded households.


The EJ Plan is divided into three parts: an Existing Conditions report based on analysis of current and forecasted demographic data; recommendations for improving equity and inclusion in the NFRMPO region's transportation planning process; and appendices, including best practices that could be adapted to Northern Colorado and a community resources guide. The project was released for public comment on February 3, 2021 and closed on March 4, 2021. The public comment received was positive and provided additional insight on how to communicate the goals and recommendations more clearly in the EJ Plan. RideNoCo Helps Provide Access to Transportation for COVID Vaccines

The NFRMPO has fast-tracked key components of the One Call/One Click Center Project laid out in the Larimer County Senior Transportation Implementation Plan to support regional efforts to remove barriers to access for COVID vaccines, especially for vulnerable populations such as older adults and individuals with disabilities. The Larimer County Office of Emergency Management was seeking a coordinated and centralized method of connecting patients who required transportation assistance to local providers able to serve them when a provider recommended reaching out to the NFRMPO as the needs of the Office of Emergency Management closely aligned with the program goals of the One Call/One Click Center.

Partnerships with the Larimer County Office on Aging and the Weld County Area Agency on Aging for funding of rides has allowed the vaccine project to expand to encompass the entire region and as of April 5, the project has received 20 calls, 12 requests for transportation, and has connected 11 people across the region to their vaccine appointments. To get connected to transportation to and from your vaccine appointment, please tell your healthcare provider at the time of scheduling or call *RideNoCo* at (970) 514-3636 if your appointment has been scheduled.
