MEETING NOTES	No comments.
ONE CALL/ONE CLICK CENTER UPDATES	Schmitt provided an update on RideNoCo including updates on the trip discovery tool, the trip scheduling steering committee, and community outreach. Additionally, the RideNoCo website, call center, and Rider's Guide is available in Spanish. Slides attached.

Discussion Items

AARP COMMUNITY CHALLENGE GRANT UPDATES	Schmitt shared that the Red Feather Lakes application to the AARP Community Challenge Grant for a ribbon-cutting event has been withdrawn since operation funds have not been secured for the project.
JUNE WORKSHOP: WALKING/ACCESSI BILITY AUDIT	Members discussed the location, timeframe, and other details for the 2022 Walk Audit. Russo noted that the Larimer County Built Environment program has materials related to walking audits (see attached), and they had done a walk audit a few years ago in Loveland. Fletcher-Carter suggested either Old Town Berthoud or another location in Loveland as the location for the walk audit. Schmitt noted that streetscape improvements are coming soon through the City of Fort Collins in the Midtown area, so this could be an opportune time to give feedback on accessibility of this area for older adults and people with disabilities. Russo suggested to connect with FC Moves to give feedback on the route. The group could also give feedback to the North College BRT planning process by conducting an walk audit in the district by connecting with Melina Dempsey or Seth Lorson with the City of Fort Collins. The group then reviewed a few potential routes in the Midtown/Foothills Mall area and agreed to conduct this walk audit in this area. Mumma suggested looking at the parking lot more in depth as well as the entrance to Trader Joe's. He noted it is

difficult to traverse between commercial buildings and the centralized mall building. Courtney also suggested visiting a low-income senior living complex (Oakbrook) that is across Stanford Rd from the Mall.

The group decided that this walk audit should last 2 hours on June 2nd from 10am to 12pm with an informal meal afterwards. About 8 MAPG members raised their hands that they would likely participate. Johnson suggested asking if any City of Fort Collins Foothills Activity Center employees would be interested in participating. Fletcher-Carter suggested inviting people living in the multifamily units near there. Russo suggested reaching out to the Arc Thrift Store along College Ave as well.

Fletcher-Carter noted that this work is also impactful on parents with strollers. The group suggested looping in school groups such as Boltz Middle School for this or future events.

The group discussed a potential Healthcare and Transportation Summit. Fletcher-Carter noted that RideNoCo will be an important tool for healthcare providers to direct clients to transportation resources.

FALL WORKSHOP: HEALTHCARE & TRANSPORTATION SUMMIT Fletcher-Carter noted that the meeting format may need to be hybrid so healthcare providers could better participate. Schmitt noted that Medical Center for the Rockies may be a good location. Fletcher-Carter noted that the Rehabilitation Center is also a good central location.

Fletcher Carter noted that having multiple, smaller summits or roundtables may be more successful. Johnson suggested that the Mobility & Access Priority Group/PAFC help put together a toolkit (agenda, questions/discussion items, etc.) to facilitate the roundtables to then help partners put these events together. Fletcher-Carter suggested that the Medical Center is a co-host and ask the co-host what agenda items the medical providers would like to discuss. Members will work together on putting together this toolkit and planning for initial healthcare & transportation roundtables at future meetings.



Phase 3: Trip Scheduling Steering Committee




- Purpose: Guide the implementation of the Trip Scheduling Software component of RideNoCo by determining agency and regional technology needs, capacity, and software functionality

Phase 3: Initial Themes




- A majority of the providers are:
 - Happy with what they currently have (60+ Ride)
 - Or are getting something tailored to their agency (Via)
- The focus of trip scheduling software needs to be on meeting the needs of RideNoCo, North 40 Mountain Alliance, and RAFT.
 - Determining the functionality needed by these two agencies and RideNoCo is the next step
- What is the role of RideNoCo in the short vs. long term?
 - Conducting intake & eligibility and providing warm transfers at Call Center on behalf of providers could be a consensus first step

 Exploring the adoption and implementation of Transactional Data Specifications (TDS) to lay the foundation for ease of coordination into the future

 Building a Customer Relationship Management (CRM) platform for RideNoCo that supports current and future program and regional needs
