



- Utilizing GTFS-Flex technology


Trip Dispatching

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Steering Committee Themes




- A majority of providers are:
 - Happy with what they currently have (60+ Ride)
 - Or are getting something tailored to their agency (Via)
- The focus of trip scheduling software needed to be on meeting the needs of RideNoCo, North 40 Mountain Alliance, and RAFT.
- What is the role of RideNoCo in the short vs. long term?
 - Conducting intake & eligibility and providing warm transfers at Call Center on behalf of providers could be a consensus first step

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Phase 3: Next Steps



- Transactional Data Specifications (TDS) lay the foundation for ease of coordination in the future
 - The NFRMPO plans to work with 2 volunteer transportation software vendors currently used by local providers to make platforms TDS compliant
- RideNoCo will procure *RideSheet* as a TDScompliant Customer Relationship Management (CRM) platform.
 - RideSheet is an open-source scheduling platform utilizing Google Sheets developed with funding from AARP




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Phase 3: Next Steps Continued



- The NFRMPO plans to develop a Call for Projects to:
 - Provide funding for small, non-profit transportation providers who have or adopt TDS-compliant software platforms
 - Funding available currently
 - Provide funding support for larger public and non-profit transportation providers in Northern Colorado to implement TDScompliant software
 - Funding support may be part of a later application
