What is the NFRMPO?

Do you live within our planning area? The North Front Range Metropolitan Planning Organization (NFRMPO) is a federally designated and required agency responsible for transportation and air quality planning in Northern Colorado. The NFRMPO is made up of 13 municipalities and the urbanized portions of Weld and Larimer.

From highways to trails, the NFRMPO is responsible for planning and funding the transportation systems that connect people and places along the North Front Range. Transportation is a major source of air pollutants like ozone and carbon monoxide. The NFRMPO is responsible for meeting state and national air quality standards.

Big projects at the NFRMPO include the short-term transportation plan, known as the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), and the long-range transportation plan, the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).

What is the Community Advisory Committee?

The CAC is a committee made up of individuals who reside in the NFRMPO planning area and do not currently serve on any other NFRMPO committees. The goal of the CAC is to be an ongoing forum for members of the community to provide input into the transportation planning process at all stages of project development. NFRMPO staff facilitate meetings, educating the public on NFRMPO process and how they can get involved in transportation planning at the regional and local levels.
