The NFRMPO Adopts the 2023 Congestion Management Process



According to the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), the CMP is a systematic and regionally accepted approach for managing congestion. Every four years, the NFRMPO reviews its Congestion Management Process (CMP) to manage congestion in the region and identify the appropriate strategies to address it. CMPs build on the performance-based planning approach of the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), identify and evaluate mitigation strategies, and describe potential implementation of described strategies.

In the process of developing the CMP, staff undertook the following steps:

- Identified congested segments of Regionally Significant Corridors (RSCs) using data from local communities, INRIX, the National Performance Management Research Dataset (NPMRDS), and other sources;
- Inventoried congestion strategies and their implementation since the 2019 CMP; and
- Developed a recommended Call for Projects capacity screening process.

The public comment period on the 2023 CMP opened May 1, 2023 and closed

May 15, 2023. The 2023 CMP was adopted by the Planning Council at their June 1, 2023 meeting.

Bike to Work (or Anywhere) Day

Bike to Work (or Anywhere!) Day was Wednesday, June 28, 2023. NFRMPO staff co-hosted five stations this year across the region:

The five stations combined had 214 visitors and Staff was able to have some great conversations with residents of the communities about transportation, safety, mobility, and trail access. In all communities, Staff talked to cyclists and walkers about the NFRMPO's [Bike and Ped Safety Reporter](#) tool and how the tool can help local agencies identify where people may or may not feel safe using active transportation.

Community Advisory Committee Applications Open

The NFRMPO's [Community Advisory Committee \(CAC\)](#) is an ongoing forum for members of the community to provide input into the transportation planning process at all stages of project development. NFRMPO staff facilitate meetings, educating the public on NFRMPO process and how they can get involved in transportation planning at the regional and local levels. The CAC meets virtually every second Thursday of the month. Total time commitment for membership on the CAC is approximately three hours a month. Any community member who does not currently serve on an NFRMPO Committee is eligible to apply.
